THE Cantata, "Rose Maiden," given by the Penang Choral Society at the Drill Hall there on Friday night last, was a great success.


SIAM is getting on. A magazine for ladies is to appear next month. The "Kul-Satri" is to be published monthly, and is to deal with all matters of interest to ladies.
