KUALA LUMPUR, Wednesday.

THE former Socialist Front president of the Malacca Municipal Council, Inche Hasnul bin Abdul Hadi, has refused a conditional release from detention.

He was detained on Feb. 13, 1965 for involvement with the former regime in Indonesia to overthrow the Malaysian Government by violence.

A former Selangor State
Assemblyman and secretary-general of the National
Convention Party, Datuk
Kampo Radjo, who was
detained on Jan 26,
1965 for the same reason,
was conditionally released
yesterday with Inche Ahmad Boestamam, a former
MP.

The conditions are the normal ones imposed on released detainees.

Conditions

A freed person is not allowed to change his specified place of residence, take part in political activities and associate with detainees or ex-detainees.

A Ministry of Home Affairs statement said here today that the three detainees could be released because "they no longer pose a serious threat to national security.

"All these three persons were arrested and detained under the Internal Security Act because of their involvement in Indo-

"The conditions of their release are the normal conditions imposed on any detainee released from detention.

"Inche Ahmad Boestamam and Datuk Kampo Radjo agreed to be released subject to the conditions and were released from detention yesterday.

"Inche Hasnul has, however, categorically stated that he is not prepared to accept any conditional release and that he would wish to stay in continued detention unless he is released unconditionally."
