US Tin Group Visits Mine And 2 Camps

KUALA LUMPUR, Nov. 8—Travelling about 50 miles in an armed convoy, the U.S. tin mission this afternoon visited two resettlement areas—the Jinjang resettlement camp (the largest in the Federation) and the Sungei Buloh agricultural resettlement camp.

The party was accompanied by the British Adviser, Selangor, Mr. A. N. Ross, and the District Officer, Kuala Lumpur.

The Jinjang resettlement area, which is about 450 acres, has about 2,500 houses with a population of 15,000, while the Sungei Buloh resettlement area is about the same size but has only about 530 houses.

This morning the mission visited the H. S. Lee tin mine at Salak South and later met Chinese miners at the Selangor Chinese Miners' Association, where they were entertained to lunch.

Before visiting the resettlement areas in the afternoon, they had discussions with the Director of Operations, Sir Harold Briggs, and the Secretary for defence.
