**HALF YEARLY GENERAL MEETING.**  
On Saturday evening the half yearly general meeting of the Perak Club was held. The President, Mr. E. W. Birch, C.M.G., was in the chair and among the members present were Dr. Fox, Messrs. Murray, Short, Potter, Henshaw, Bailey, Kennedy, Ashby, Moss, Josa and Sayers (Hon. Secretary.)

The minutes of the previous meeting having been read and confirmed, the President explained that certain suggestions agreed to at the former meeting had not yet been carried out as funds had been diverted towards renewing the billiard tables.

As regards the bowling alley he requested Mr. Moss to explain what had been done. Mr. Moss said that Mr. Arthur Stephens had written to Penang on the subject and received a reply to the effect that they in Penang were disappointed with their alley which was too short. He suggested awaiting Mr. Arthur Stephens' return, which would not be long, before proceeding further with the matter. Mr. Sayers announced that, although he advertised, no tenders were received for the construction of the alley.

The President stated that \$1,550 had been provided by Government in next year's estimates for new bath rooms, covered way, repairs, etc. to the club building.

The accounts which shewed a profit of \$423.27 on the half year's working were passed on the proposal of Dr. Fox seconded by Mr. Murray.

The President next announced that for the next twelve months Capt. Barrett had been elected Cricket Captain and Mr. W. S. Goldie, Football Captain. Dr. Fox, the present Cricket Captain, did not desire re-nomination and Mr. M. A. V. Allen, the retiring Football Captain, was shortly going on leave.

It was also announced by the President that Mr. Chung Thye Phin had presented
