The Selangor Motor Union has been revived, the new Committee being as follows :—Mr Justice Innes, president, Mr. G. S. Morgan (Hon. Sec. and Treasurer), the Hon. Mr. A. K. E. Hampshire, Mr. J. L. Sime, Mr. H. R. Moullin and Mr. E. C. Wakefield.

Rumours have been revived regarding the resignation of Sir John Jordan, the British Minister at Peking. The Peking correspondent of the *Asahi* wires to say that the recall of Sir John Jordan has at last been decided on. His successor will be the present Director of the Oriental Bureau in the Foreign Office in London. It is added that the succeeding Minister is expected in the early part of July in Japan, whence he will proceed to Peking to relieve Sir John Jordan of his post.

The death has occurred of Mr. A. J. McGlew, who had been resident in Kobe for about 27 years. Mr McGlew came to Japan from the United States, whither he had gone from England as a young man. While in New York he became an American citizen, in order to be able to cast a vote in one of the periodical efforts made to cleanse municipal politics from Tammany. After conducting business under his own name for some years, Mr. McGlew became

manager of the above office of Messrs
Carlowitz & Co., from which position he
retired about eight years ago.
