Mrs. Maria Navisal Paiya, widow of the late Mr. J. S. Victoria, who was a well-known merchant in Colombo, died at Manapad, South India, on November 7.

Our Hongkong correspondent wires that the death has occurred in London of Dr. G. P. Jordan, who for thirty years was Hongkong port health officer, a leading practitioner and ex-provost and chancellor of the university.

The death occurred on November 22 at the Colombo General Hospital of Mr. Thomas Parry, of Ootacamund, South India. Deceased, who was returning to South India from Home after a holiday, was taken ill on board and on the arrival of the vessel in Colombo was removed to the General Hospital.

The Rt. Hon. Sir West Ridgeway, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., K.C.S.I., President of the British North Borneo Chartered Company, is stated to be on the steamer Egypt bound for Borneo. He is probably accompanied by Mr. W. P. Flynn, who is interested in, and acts as Secretary for a number of companies owning estates in Borneo.

The death occurred yesterday at Nallore, Jaffna, Ceylon, of the Rev. John Backus, the grandfather of Messrs. J. T. N. and A. M. Handy of Singapore. The late Mr. Backus was 81 years old at the time of his death and had served the Church of England in Ceylon as a Minister for the last 58 years, only retiring from active work early this year.
