The resignation by Lieut. G. H. Warren of his Commission in the Straits Settlements Volunteer Force, has been accepted.

Mr. G. E. S. Cubitt, Conservator of Forests, Straits Settlements and F.M.S., resumed the duties of his appointment on the 6th inst.
