SUNGEI RAMAL SYNDICATE.

Annual General Meeting at Kuala Lumpur.

(From Our Own Correspondent).
Kuala Lumpur, March 10.

At the annual general meeting of the Sungei Ramal Syndicate, Ltd., the Hon. Mr. Kindersley, presiding, said, inter alia: At last year's meeting I said that the previous year had been the worst on record for the rubber industry and the future outlook was gloomy in the extreme. I very nearly had to repeat the statement this year, but restriction by legislation of the export of rubber from November 1, 1922, saved the situation. If restriction had been introduced in January, 1921, when asked for, an enormous sum of money would have been saved this country and the British Empire.

He paid a high tribute to Mr. Still, editor of the Straits Times, for his persistent and able advocacy of the policy that was now adopted at the eleventh hour. He declared that if it had not been for the constant pressure brought to bear by Mr. Still, in the Straits Times, when it appeared hopeless ever to wake the Singapore Government from their lethargy, we would not even now have restriction in force.
