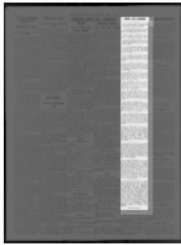

Guthrie and Co., Kuala Lumpur, have received a cablegram from the secretaries of Kembau Jelei Rubber to the effect that, in respect of the financial year ended Dec. 31 last, the directors have declared a final dividend of 5 per cent (making 12½ per cent for the year) and have decided to carry forward the balance, viz. £19,462.

By kind permission of Lt.-Col. C. J. The directors recommend that this amount be dealt with as follows:—Transfer to reserve account \$30,000, carry forward to next account \$16,254.17.
