# Replanting Delayed

UNSETTLED conditions in Malaya are delaying an extensive programme of re-planting by the Kuala Lum-pur Rubber Company, the Chairman (Mr. E. B. Skinner) told stockholders at their 42nd annual meeting.
"The work of rehabilitation

continues as and when labour is available," said Mr. Skinner.
"We hope that, during the present financial year most of the work apart from solder. the work, apart from replant

the work apart from replanting, will be completed."

"A programme is in hand for the replanting of areas of rubber cut out during the Japanese occupation, with the exception of areas which are under lease for mining.

"Progress is being delayed by the present unsettled conditions."

The Chairman (Mr. C. D. Rotch) of the Sungel Siput Rubber Plantations told the annual shareholders meeting that a company manager in Malaya had reported:

"One and all are thoroughly disgusted with the present handling of this Emergency, which should rever have been allowed to occur."

At a meeting of the Tall Ayer Rubber Estates stockholders, the chairman (Mr. F. E. Maguire) said the replanting programme for 1948 had not been carried out because of heavy labour demand through floods.

He said that the low premium on crepe rubber over smoked sheets made it necessary for the company to stop producing crepe rubber as "not a paying proposition."
