# 2 Bandits Killed In Police Swoop

A BANDIT armed with a Tommy gun was killed, a woman agent arrested and a campdiscovered and destroyed in the Tanjong Tuallang Forest Reserve, Perak, yesterday afternoon.

In the Telok Anson area another police party killed a second bandit and arrested five others.

The party which was on its way from Sungei Kuning saw a gang of 20 Chinese as-sembling in a coffee-shop.

The police challenged them and after their warning was ignored they opened fire.

Communists receipts were found on the dead body.

A police patrol contacted 25 bandits and fought for some time before the gang




ast night bandits raided Union Estate, in the Batu Pahat area, killing two men including a Sikh watchman and burning down all the estate buildings.

At dawn yesterday Kuala Gula in the Krian area of Perak was screened and five persons were detained. Special constables, ambusned by third armed bandits on the 21st mile Lenga Road, in the Muar area, fought back and escaped unscathed.

A Chinese was murdered last night near the ninth mile village on the Kuala Lumpur to Kajang Road.
