Hari Raya Tragedy In Kajang



Kajang Circuit Magistrate, KAJANG, Mon. A 50-year-old Malay, Jambol, who was severely burnt when his house caught fire early on Saturday, the day before Hari Raya, died at Kajang Hospital last night.

Jambol's daughter went into an anteroom in the house at the 16th mile, Recko Road, one mile from Kajang, when she stumbled and fell with the oil lamp she was carrying.

The lamp ignited some dried leaves which were stored there for making mats.

The father, seeing the light, went into the room and did not attempt to call for help, but tried to stamp out the fire.

Sarong On Fire

The sarong he was wearing caught fire.

Jambol's wife, hearing the noise and seeing flames went into the room and pulled her husband out of the room.

They managed to get out of the house, but little property could be saved in spite of the efforts of the neighbours to put out the fire. The building was completely destroyed. Jambol was a retired syce.

He leaves several children, one of whom is a special constable on Sungai Ramal Estate, Kajang.
