Student killed on way home for the holidays

KUALA LUMPUR, Sat. — An Ipoh student returning to spend his school holidays at his home in Johore was killed while travelling on the south-bound mail train last night.

Police believe the boy, Abdul Aziz bin Abdul Ghani, 16, was struck by a girder and hurled to the ground while leaning from a carriage window or door as the train was passing over the railway bridge at Bangi, near Kajang.

His body with severe head injuries was found beside the tracks at the bridge at 12.25 a.m. today. There were blood traces on the bridge structure.

Aziz, a pupil of the Tengku Abdul Rahman English School, Ipoh, was on his way to his home at Pontian Kechil. Federation schools closed yesterday for the first term holidays.
