Malaysia baru sahaja melalui proses pilihanraya yang ke-13, satu sistem pemilihan kerajaan sepertimana yang dituntut bagi sebuah negara demokrasi. Dalam PRU pertama tahun 1955, gabungan parti Perikatan (Gabungan UMNO, MCA dan MIC) telah memperoleh kemenangan yang hampir bersih, iaitu dengan memenangi 51 kerusi parliment, hanya satu kerusi dimenangi oleh pihak lawan, iaitu dari Parti Islam SeMalaya yang dikenali sebagai PMIP pada ketika itu. Kerusi tunggal yang dimenangi oleh PMIP itu ialah bagi kawasan Krian, Perak, dan calon mereka yang bertanding disitu ialah Haji Ahmad Tuan Hussain.

Sir Onn is certain

A PERSONAL quality, not often associated with Dato Sir Onn bin Jaafar, Secretary General of Party Negara, has become increasingly marked as the Federal elections campaign has proceeded towards its close. He is imperturbable.

In the face of sweeping and often vicious statements frequently leveled by young Malay leaders of other parties, Dato Sir Onn has always been ready with a quiet, complete answer.

While others have been quick to jump to conclusions, Dato Sir Onn could not effectively rule the country, Dato Sir Onn has remained calm throughout, not only for himself but for Party Negara.

When asked if he was ready for polling, Dato Sir Onn was able to say: "I have no fears about the result of the election." In the rural areas, when asked about what he had been doing, he remarked: "These last few days I have been trying to talk to men to make sure they have every opportunity of hearing both sides of the question."



Onn badly beaten

Highlight of the **election** was the defeat of Dato Sir Onn bin Ja'afar, the Party Negara leader, who was well beaten by Inche Suleiman. The Alliance man polled 8,745 votes against Dato Sir Onn's 2,802.


Inche Suleiman was chaired shoulder high by the cheering crowd when the result was announced about 2.30 a.m.

There were some fantastic majorities in the Alliance victories. In Malacca Luar, Inche Gaffar bin Baba, secretary of the local UMNO branch, had a majority of 23,969 over his opponent, Inche Ja'afar Tan, who got only 2,281 votes. Tengku Abdul Rahman had a majority of 20,987.

Mr. Tan Siew Sin, son of Dato Sir Cheng-lock Tan, President of the Malayan Chinese Association, also won his seat convincingly.

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Pekerja dihalang keluar mengundi

Antara isu menarik dan kontroversi yang berlaku sewaktu pilihanraya 1955 ialah, kontroversi yang berlaku keatas pekerja syarikat Keretapi Tanah Melayu (Malaya Railways). Para pekerja tidak diberi kelepasan untuk keluar mengundi oleh pihak pengurusan, keadaan ini menyebabkan wakil pekerja telah menyampaikan aduan kepada ibupejabat parti Perikatan. Akhirnya arahan telah dikeluarkan kepada pihak pengurusan agar memberi pelepasan khas untuk mengundi, arahan tersebut dipatuhi dan pada pekerja diberi pelepasan selama dua jam untuk keluar menunaikan tanggungjawab mereka untuk mengundi.
