

Tan Sri Abdul Samad Ismail (*b. 18 April 1924, Singapore*<sup>1</sup>–*d. 4 September 2008, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia*) was a journalist, political activist, and creative writer, known for promoting Malay nationalism.<sup>2</sup> He was a founding member of the Gerakan Angkatan Muda (Geram),<sup>3</sup> the PAP (People's Action Party ([http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP\\_2015-02-04\\_103701.html](http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP_2015-02-04_103701.html))),<sup>4</sup> and the National Association of Writers (PENA).<sup>5</sup> For his accomplishments in the literary and journalistic field, he was awarded the title, *Pejuang Sastera*, meaning “literature champion” by the Malaysian Government.<sup>6</sup>

### **Early life**

Samad, who was of *Javanese* ([http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP\\_2013-08-06\\_115832.html](http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP_2013-08-06_115832.html)) parentage, was born and educated in Singapore and was effectively bilingual in Malay and English.<sup>7</sup> He studied in *Victoria School* ([http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP\\_2013-06-06\\_184600.html](http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP_2013-06-06_184600.html)) and completed his *Senior Cambridge* ([http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP\\_2016-06-24\\_110607.html](http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP_2016-06-24_110607.html)) in 1940.<sup>8</sup> He launched into journalism almost immediately, starting as a cub reporter in the newly established Malay daily, *Utusan Melayu* ([http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP\\_1088\\_2007-06-12.html](http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP_1088_2007-06-12.html)), in 1941.<sup>9</sup>

### **Politics**

During the Japanese Occupation from 1942 to 1945, *Utusan Melayu* became *Berita Malai* – the propaganda machine controlled by the Japanese. Samad was its editor.<sup>10</sup> After the war, the British briefly jailed him for a year in 1946 for his anti-British articles.<sup>11</sup> Samad returned to *Utusan Melayu* as its assistant editor after his release.<sup>12</sup> He used his position with the paper to promote Malay nationalism.<sup>13</sup> His close ties to left-wing Malay nationalists, and his anti-colonial stance led to a second arrest in 1951.<sup>14</sup> This time, he was detained at *St John's island* ([http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP\\_228\\_2005-01-22.html](http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP_228_2005-01-22.html)) till 1953.<sup>15</sup> Upon his release in 1953, he returned to *Utusan Melayu once again*, and also went on to became a founding member of the People's Action Party along with *Lee Kuan Yew* ([http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP\\_2013-03-18\\_164023.html](http://eresources.nlb.gov.sg/infopedia/articles/SIP_2013-03-18_164023.html)).<sup>16</sup> However, arising political and ideological differences led to Samad leaving the party in 1957.<sup>17</sup>

Samad was posted to Indonesia as a correspondent for *Utusan Melayu* in 1957, where he served only six months before returning to Singapore.<sup>18</sup> He left the paper and joined the Straits Times press in 1958, where he would head the *Berita Harian*, and later the *New Straits Times* in Malaysia.<sup>19</sup> Samad headed for Kuala Lumpur in 1959.<sup>20</sup> There, he played a major role in the takeover of the Singapore controlled Straits Times operations in Kuala Lumpur, and the establishment of the *New Straits Times*.<sup>21</sup> He remained a strong advocate of the Malay language and culture, and he expressed some of these thoughts through his Malay novels which he began writing in the early 1960s.<sup>22</sup>

On 23 June 1976, he was arrested again under the Malaysian Internal Security Act for probable involvement of pro-communist activities, and was banned from entering Singapore for trying to subvert the country using political means.<sup>23</sup> The ban was lifted in 1990.<sup>24</sup> He returned to the *New Straits Times* after his release in 1981, and was appointed editorial advisor to the New Straits Times Press group, until his retirement in 1988.<sup>25</sup>

Samad was instrumental in the establishment of the *Angkatan Sasterawan '50* literary movement in Singapore which champions Malay rights. In addition, he also assisted in the setting up of the National Writers Association of Malaysia, and Institute of Language and Literature – Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka.<sup>26</sup> Samad was the first Malaysian to receive the Magsaysay award for journalism, literature and creative communication arts in 1994. The award is considered Asia's equivalent of the Nobel Prize.<sup>27</sup>
